Rabbi Isaac Choua is the Rabbinic Advisor and a Central Council Member of the Sephardic Jewish Brotherhood of America, and serves as Associate Museum Curator at Kehila Kedosha Janina Synagogue and Museum. He is the New York Programming Lead at JIMENA, where he is building the New York Educators Cohort and partnering with Jewish institutions to bring Sepharadi history into mainstream Jewish education. He is also the founder of Qeriya, an initiative dedicated to Tora study and recitation.

Isaac serves as Director of Operations and Programming at the Council for a Secure America, where he works on diplomatic outreach, programmatic briefings, operations, and research initiatives focused on U.S. national security, energy and natural resources, and the Abraham Accords. Previously, he spent six years at the World Jewish Congress, where he served as MENA Communities Liaison and Global Interfaith Lead of the Jewish Diplomatic Corps.

He holds rabbinic ordination and a Master's degree in Medieval Jewish History from the Bernard Revel Graduate School of Jewish Studies at Yeshiva University. He was a Broome & Allen Fellow at the American Sephardi Federation and is the author of *Struggling in the Wilderness*, a Substack focused on current events, Sepharadi history, memory, and thought.
